From Pastor Mark...

Reformation In the Church & Personally

"If you continue in my word, you are truly my disciples; and you will know the truth, and the truth will make you free."

John 8:31-32

On October 26, we commemorate the Reformation. The Bible readings for worship that day include the passage which changed Martin Luther's life which is Romans 3:28, "For we hold that a person is justified by faith apart from works prescribed by the law." This was an epiphany for him in helping him move from seeing God only as a wrathful God of rules and regulations that we can never perfectly follow, to seeing God as being filled with grace and love. That insight set the foundation for the Reformation. We commemorate the day Luther pounded the 95 Theses to the Wittenberg Chapel Door – October 31, 1517 – as the start of the Reformation.

After Martin Luther was outlawed by the pope and the emperor, the Reformation continued – sometimes chaotically. But its basis was a preaching movement – the sharing and hearing of God's Word. From there, the first outward signs that more was happening than inner spiritual reforms were the marriage of priests and the mass resignation of monks from monasteries. Next, various changes in worship were instituted. So you can see how the reformers saw renewal in one's faith-life as being intertwined with (a.) how we live our daily life *and* (b.) with how we conduct our congregational worship.

Because of the courage and faithfulness of the Reformers, we have inherited a rich faith tradition in the Lutheran church (interestingly Martin Luther was not wild about having a church named after him). In addition, the larger church has benefited and learned from their teachings and witness. For their faithfulness we commemorate their work and we give thanks to God.

Let it be our prayer to ask God for the courage and the insight to continually engage in the Reform not only of the Church's witness, but of our personal faith life.

God grant us grace to grow in faith so as to walk content in His ways.

September Council Minutes

Thursday, September 18th, 2025 - 6:30 p.m.

Present: Mark Berger, Brian Bergs, Linda Collins, Glenn Hietala, Michael Johnson, Zach Leibold, Faye Sandy, Chris Scholl, Renae Stueber, Steve Tschida and Pastor Mark.

Absent: Tom Lippert and Pam Trang

Faye Sandy called the meeting to order. Opening Prayer was led by Mark Berger. Chris Scholl offered to lead prayer next month.

Secretary's Report: Zach Leibold moved to approve the August Council minutes with the correction of the spelling of Matthew Neutz's name. Glenn Hietala seconded. Motion carried

Treasurer's Report: Brian Bergs shared the August Financial Reports. The Budget comparison shows we are 26k over budget on revenue mainly due to mortgage principal. This is very strong compared to last year, but those numbers are somewhat misleading due to the large amount coming in for the mortgage principal earlier this year. It's a better indicator to look at whether our income is covering our expenses and we are doing that. The Balance Sheet shows a healthy amount in the checking account to cover expenses. We started early in the year with lower offering and have not really recovered, this is something we need to watch closely. We are significantly under budget for the expenses this year and well under last year as well, this is primarily due to fewer hours worked by the Youth Director and the Custodian compared to budget. Linda Collins moved to approve the August Financial Reports. Steve Tschida seconded. Motion carried.

Pastor's Report: Pastor Mark reported he is working on visits to those who are ill or shut ins. He is also preaching on the first Thursday of each month at Highland Living Center and hoping to work with other nursing homes locally soon.

He shared a thank you to those who have been cleaning as volunteers. Thank you to Faye, George and Mark Berger for their skills building the whale. Thank you to Sarah, Amanda and Heather for their work behind the scenes to get things done for Rally Sunday and all the volunteers who helped with set-up and clean-up.

People to keep in our prayers: Family of Bill Messerschmidt, Millie is placing flowers on the altar on Sunday in his memory. Sandy Larsen's family, as her brother just passed away.

New Member class is being delayed to September 28 due to the Tough Talks discussion session, Nick Leibold will also help lead this session on Sunday. The goal of these is coming together as people of God to talk and listen to each other. The new 'Foundations of Christianity' Bible Study will also be pushed back to begin on October 5. Sermons in September are going back to where we left off in Genesis.

Confirmation class has 8 students this year in grades 7-8. The fall semester will focus on the Old Testament and the Apostles' Creed. Claire Stueber is the one confirmand this fall, she will be confirmed on Sunday, October 26th.

Old Business:

Forward in Faith Reports: Faye is checking in with all the council members on how their meetings went and collecting the surveys. She is starting to compile the data. Seems like security is a major concern from what has come in so far.

Rally Sunday Recap: It seemed to pop up quickly, so it was difficult to get everything done. We may need to plan ahead a little more next time. Otherwise, the whale and Blaine MacNeil as Jonah were a big hit!

Operation Christmas Child Recognition Frame: We still need to hang the recognition from Operation Christmas Child, an appropriate place needs to be found. Which also brings up the question of gifts to the church, both physical and financial. The council will review and vote on a policy regarding gifts to the church at the next meeting.

New Business

Pine Country Bank CD Renewal: The CD at Pine Country Bank is set to renew today, September 18th for another 9 months. Brian recommends we do this renewal as we are unlikely to need these funds in the next 9 months. Glenn Hietala moved to renew the CD for 9 months. Zach Leibold seconded. Motion carried. Brian will make a recommendation to put further money into a CD next month, to earn interest on money we are not currently using.

Worship Band: The Worship Band Team is feeling overwhelmed with extra services and special rehearsal coordinating. Those who are currently handling scheduling are very busy with their paid work and cannot devote more time to special events right now. They will prepare a description of what this extra scheduling entails and bring it to the council so we can find a solution. Possibly someone paid to help coordinate these extra events.

Confirmation Mentors: This idea for extra encouragement and relationships within the congregation for the confirmation students was presented last year. There are 8 students and Faye Sandy has worked to find 8 adults willing to be a mentor. They are hoping to set up a time to meet with parents, mentors and mentees with Pastor Mark.

Custodian Job Offer: Todd Anderson applied for the Custodian job. The Executive Team interviewed him and then performed a background check. At this point the Executive Team unanimously recommends hiring Todd with a 3-month probation period. Chris Scholl moved and Mike Johnson seconded to hire Todd with the Executive Team's recommendations. Motion carried.

A/C Duct Insulation Quote: Tom Lippert got a quote from Prime Mechanical Insulation, Inc. to wrap the Air conditioning ducts that we had issues with this year in 3" of fiberglass. The estimated cost is \$1490 and should prevent further problems. Glenn Hietala moved and Mark Berger seconded to get the ducts wrapped for no more than \$1500. Motion carried.

Gutters: Faye Sandy noticed on Rally Sunday that the gutters above the doors need to be cleaned. Zach Leibold offered to get these cleaned and the issue will be passed on to the Finance Team for the future.

Reports

Church Secretary: Sarah brought forward the idea of replacing one computer, which is budgeted for each year. Amanda is having issues and has requested her computer be the one replaced. As it is the oldest, this makes sense. Zach Leibold moved and Steve Tschida seconded to buy a new computer for Amanda with a \$1200 maximum budget. Motion carried.

Ministry Volunteer Coordinator Report: Amanda shared her ongoing projects and Bible studies. Planning for Trunk or Treat has begun, it will be Saturday, October 25th from 1-3 pm.

Children's Team: Sunday School has officially begun. There are 19 students registered and 9 teachers. They are using the Two or More curriculum or the Bible text for the week. The Christmas Program will be December 14 with rehearsals November 16 & 23 and December 7.

Youth Report: A new event is being planned for after Trunk or Treat. The Youth Fall Festival will be the same day with activities for older youth.

Congregational Life: Planned Rally Sunday and the meals required for that.

Mission & Outreach: Operation Christmas Child Boxes are ordered, Heather is hoping to have the youth pack 100 boxes!

Finance & Management Team & Worship & Prayer Team: Did not meet.

Brian Bergs moved to adjourn the meeting, Mark Berger seconded. Motion carried.
