One hike was especially challenging. It was in the Porcupine Mountains Wilderness Area along the East and West River Trails Presque Isle River Area. Faith Lutheran Church Council Meeting - August 21st, 2025

Present: Pastor Mark Johnson, Mark Berger, Brian Bergs, Linda Collins, Glenn Hietala, Michael Johnson, Zach Leibold, Chris Scholl, Renae Stueber, Pam Trang, Sarah Kalkbrenner. Absent: Tom Lippert, Faye Sandy, Steve Tschida

Zach called the meeting to order and opened in prayer. Additions to Agenda: Added under new business: Matt Neutz's request to borrow sound equipment for a Sept. 12th Wedding.

Council Secretary's report: Brian moved to accept June minutes as presented: Glenn seconded. The motion carried.

Treasurer's report (Brian): For July, Actual Revenues were over budget by ~\$30,000. The majority of this is from donations received for mortgage principal and Phase II Construction. We are running behind on general revenues compared to last year. Expenses are running ~\$13,400 under budget. \$6,000 of this is from committees not spending their budgets yet. Rest is from support staff (Heather) not working as many hours as planned. Expenses are running a little more than last year. The underage in general revenue is sustainable because Heather is working fewer hours than planned. There has not been a lot of change in the Total Bank balance. Chris moved to accept the June & July financial reports as presented. Mark seconded. The motion carried.

Credit Card Update – we now have a credit card thru Pine Country Bank. The card is in Brian's name. We can have up to 10 people on the card.

Pastor's Report: Richard Collins' surgery went well. Pastor is getting ready for Confirmation. They will start the 2nd Wednesday in September. New member classes will start Sept. 21st. He will be teaching a Sunday morning Bible study. He thanked Faye for her work on getting the job description together for janitor position, and thanked Sarah and Amanda for keeping slots filled and the work organized. Thank you to everyone who is helping with the cleaning. Congratulations to Zach on his wedding.

Old Business:

Door Knob Change: this was taken care of this week by Tom Lippert.

Forward in Faith Check-in: council members shared their progress.

Security Updates: Any use of the property for streaming for social media needs to be preapproved. We need to be diligent to keep the doors locked when they aren't monitored.

New Business:

Sound Equipment Request: Matt Neutz requested to borrow sound equipment (an amp and 2 speakers currently in the garage) for a Sept 12th Wedding he is playing for. Brian moved to approve, Glenn seconded. The motion carried.

Rally Sunday: Faye, Amanda, and Heather met with Bev from Congregational Life and Pat Rioux from Mission & Outreach last week to plan the event. The Mission Team is donating funds for the event. Concerns were expressed about holding the worship service outdoors.

Reports:

Church Secretary Report (Sarah): Our copier company is no longer making parts for our current copier. They presented a proposal for a different copier. There haven't been any issues with the current copier, so nothing will be done at this time. Our Payroll company is changing their name from Ministry Works to Brotherhood Works. We received a facility use request from a support group for grand-parents who are raising their grandchildren. They are looking for a place to meet the 2nd Wednesday of the month from 12:30 - 2:30 pm. Someone would need to be here to let them in and make sure the church is locked up when they are gone. Pastor Mark will check into this.

End date for Roger Fernelius – Roger's final day as the day he turned in his keys.

Ministry Volunteer Coordinator Report: no report

Ministry Team Reports

Children's (Mike) – They talked about the new curriculum "Two or More". They looked for curriculum that would work for combining classes when they are small. They discussed Rally Sunday. More teachers are needed. They asked if the children's offering (bucket money) can be given to Operation Christmas Child. There is currently \$1,834.07 in the Kids Tin Bucket fund. They were informed that they can decide where it should go. This will be reported back to the committee, they will make a decision on where to give the money.

Congregational Life (Mark) - There is a cake reception on August 31st for Fernalius's. Rally Sunday was discussed.

Finance & Management (Brian) — We need about \$20,000 total for chairs. There is a new engraving company for the columbarium. Thank you to everyone who is helping to clean the church. They are getting a quote to insulate the 24" pipes above the sanctuary. They think this is what caused the leak by the dishwasher.

Mission & Outreach (Linda) – Glenn moved to donate \$1,000 for expenses for the School Symposium put on by Youth For Christ. Chris seconded. The motion carried. This has been vetted by the Committee. Brian moved to donate a maximum of \$1,500 from Mission & Outreach for Rally Sunday. Glenn seconded. The motion carried. \$250 will be for the whale. Approximately \$840 is needed for the food.

Worship & Prayer - Did not meet.

Youth & Family/ Youth Director Report (Renee & Heather) She passed around a youth calendar for now through December. An update was provided on the mission trip. Heather is checking out a couple of different options for the next youth mission trip. There is a new youth bulletin board in the hallway by the bathroom. Feed. Bible is the new curriculum that will be used this year for the youth. Heather is holding a meeting this Sunday for people who want to help with the youth.

Mark moved to adjourn the meeting. Chris seconded. We closed with the Lord's Prayer.
